

# 2010 Taste of India - Classic

## 7 days/6 nights

Delhi, Agra & the Taj Mahal, Jaipur & Amber Fort, Samode

### Taste of India - Classic

A perfect introduction to India's popular "Golden Triangle", with the added bonus of charming Samode. Start your journey in Delhi's old and new areas. Travel on to Agra and the breath-taking Taj Mahal. Drive on to the 'Pink City' of Jaipur, its opulent City Palace and the imposing hilltop fortress at nearby Amber. Finish with a stay in the traditional village of Samode - and an experience of timeless rural India.

All road travel is in comfortable minibuses or mid-sized coaches. Your journey is escorted by both a Western tour leader, based on a minimum of seven travellers, and a local English-speaking guide in each location. Groups are never more than 18 travellers in size.

### Tour grading - EASY to MODERATE

This journey is suitable for travellers with an average level of fitness and independent mobility. The tour involves plenty of walking and stair climbing, sometimes over uneven surfaces and in the heat. There are also rides on rickshaws, jeeps, and walking tours (up to 3 to 4 kms). You need to be able to board and disembark vehicles independently. The longest road journey is approximately 5 hours in duration.

While accommodation is of three to four star standard, this is not 'sanitised' travel; by day you will walk through markets and villages, meet local people, and sample local food.

### What's Included

- 6 nights accommodation
- Breakfast daily, one dinner and one lunch
- All transfers and road transport in modern, air-conditioned vehicles
- All sightseeing as specified including entrance fees
- Rural jeep safari at Samode
- Expert Western tour leader (group size seven minimum) and local guides throughout
- Arrival transfer in Delhi and departure transfer Samode to either Jaipur or Delhi (included if taken on final day of tour - later Delhi transfers can be booked at extra cost)

### Climate

Taste of India departs in most months. In north India the most pleasant travel months are October to March, when days are typically warm and dry. Nights are cool to cold, especially in December and January when some areas drop to 0°C. In general, north India is hottest from late April to June, with temperatures averaging 35 to 40°C. Rainy season is July to September in the north.

### Itinerary

#### Day 1 - Arrive Delhi

Upon arrival in Delhi you will be met and transferred to your hotel. Tonight meet your tour leader (or local guide) for welcome drinks and a tour briefing. (Since many international flights into Delhi arrive late at night, this may take place tomorrow morning). **Two nights PARKLANDS GREEN PARK**

#### Day 2 - Delhi

Discover the capital's most famous sites including Humayun's Tomb and the Jama Masjid or Friday Mosque, and explore Old Delhi on an exciting rickshaw ride.

#### Day 3 - Delhi to Agra

Depart Delhi and drive four hours to Agra. Visit Agra Fort, a marble inlay workshop, and view the Taj from the banks of the Yamuna River at Mehtab Bagh. **One night MANSINGH PALACE AGRA**

#### Day 4 - Agra and the Taj Mahal to Jaipur

An early rise to see the Taj Mahal at dawn; this is an ideal time to visit, especially for photographers. This afternoon travel on to Jaipur by road. **Two nights MANSINGH TOWER JAIPUR**

#### Day 5 - Jaipur

Today tour the famous sights of Jaipur including the ornate Palace of the Winds, the opulent City Palace, and its adjoining observatory. Also visit the town's bazaar streets and stop off for lunch. This afternoon travel to the hills outside town to explore the imposing Amber Fort.

#### Day 6 - Jaipur to Samode

This morning is free until a midday drive to Samode, a traditional Rajasthan country town, with an enchanting centuries-old palace and lively streets. Take a jeep safari through the surrounding farmland and villages. **One night SAMODE BAGH**

#### Day 7 - Samode to Jaipur or Delhi

Free until your departure transfer to either Jaipur or Delhi.

## Hotel Brief

### Parklands Green Park in Delhi

A small, comfortable modern hotel in south Delhi. Rooms feature timber floors and flat screen TVs, and there is an excellent café/restaurant in the lobby.

### Mansingh Palace in Agra

A good standard hotel with spacious common areas and a pool located in the main tourist district of Agra.

### Mansingh Tower in Jaipur

A comfortable and centrally-located base in this popular city. Features a range of facilities including a swimming pool and well-liked restaurants.

### Samode Bagh in Samode

A lovely tented camp set in picturesque ornamental gardens with a swimming pool and wild peacocks. The tents are very comfortable with attached permanent Western bathrooms, large comfy beds and electricity.

## Visa Requirements

All foreign tourists to India, except for nationals of some mostly neighbouring countries, must possess a valid visa. Visas are not issued on arrival and are valid from date of issue, not date of entry into India. More detailed visa information is available in our pre-departure information. It is your responsibility to make sure that visa requirements are fulfilled.

## Health Issues

Good medical advice usually recommends vaccinations/prophylactics in advance of travel to India. We suggest that you consult with your doctor to discuss health care needs specific to your holiday.

## Insurance

You must be comprehensively insured as a condition of travelling with Travel Indochina. Insurance should include cover for personal accident and medical expenses, evacuation and repatriation, baggage loss, and cancellation or curtailment of your holiday. Your booking will not be confirmed if you cannot confirm possession of appropriate insurance, and our ground operations have the right to prevent you from travelling in the event that you cannot present your insurance details at the start of the tour. Your travel agent can organise travel insurance for you.
